Purpose

The National IT Executive is responsible for ensuring the YP Network is appropriately enabled by strong underpinning platforms and applications, in line with the National IT Strategy. They are also responsible for developing and implementing appropriate processes and controls to ensure strict identity and access management practices are in place, as well as strong security controls. The role can also advise on the potential deployment of new technologies to further enhance the user experience.

This role will work closely with the national leadership team, the National IT Director and the appropriate local teams as needed.

Responsibilities

- Manage, advise, deploy and work with some exciting cloud technologies;
- Provision of appropriate platforms and applications access to the YP Network;
- Manage, review and update enterprise architecture;
- Manage all identity and access controls ensuring the YP Network is appropriately protected;
- Manage all security controls ensuring the YP Network is appropriately protected;
- Collaborating and knowledge sharing with other YP teams within the Network;
- Performing continuous improvement activities to constantly enhance the user experience;
- Supporting the UNAA National Board, National Executive Director and the wider national office in any other way deemed necessary in support of the YP objectives;
- Attendance at all meetings (or delegated) with the leadership team and National Office.

What Are We Looking For?

We are looking for someone who has:

- Experience with IT platforms and applications (particularly cloud technologies);
- Experience / exposure to identity and access and security controls / practices;
- Exceptional interpersonal, communication and organisational skills;
