#### **Purpose**

The National Lead is responsible for providing overall leadership, coordination and strategic direction for the UNAA YP Network. They are also responsible for fostering relationships with other UNAA bodies (i.e. Local Divisions, UN Youth, National Programs) and other relevant organisations within the community to build a collaborative environment and to create greater impact. The National Lead will also work closely with and up to the UNAA National Executive Director, UNAA National President and UNAA National Board and provide input as needed, acting as a conduit between the National Board and the YP Network.

#### Responsibilities

- Leading, managing, coordinating and enhancing the impact of the UNAA National Young Professionals Network;
- Building relationships and managing diverse stakeholders of varying levels of talent, experience, age and background;
- Build and implement YP national programs around career and training and connect and relevance, working with the National Executive team;
- Exploring opportunities to expand the network in consultation with key stakeholders including the UNAA Divisions and UN Youth to maximise the UNAA's overall impact:
- Formalising and standardising the Young Professional Network's governance mechanisms;
- Collaborating and knowledge sharing with other YP teams within the Network;
- Accountable for National YP Network budget;
- Accountable for the delivery of education, advocacy and other programs;
- Supporting the National Executive Director and the wider national office in any other way deemed necessary in support of the YP objectives;
- Attendance at all meetings (or delegated) with the leadership team and National Office.
