**Students are invited to use any visual art media to communicate selected articles of the UN Convention on the Rights of the Child (UN CRC) and the Universal Declaration of Human Rights (UDHR).**

### YEARS 4 TO 6:

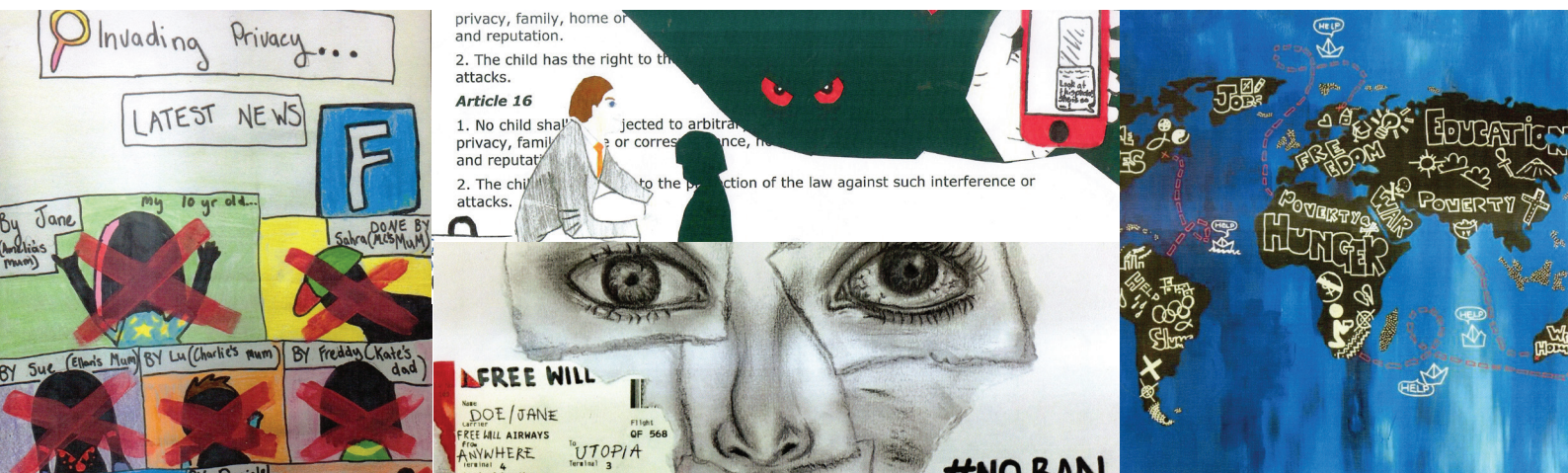
Education should develop each child's personality and talents to the full. It should encourage children to respect their parents, their cultures and other cultures. (UN CRC Article 29)

### > HOW TO ENTER

- > Schools select their leading entries (to a maximum of four finalists) for electronic submission with an entry form including a declaration by the Principal that it is the student's own work.
- > Entries must be submitted to [gcs@unaa-wa.org.au](mailto:gcs@unaa-wa.org.au) no later than 5pm Friday 31 August 2018.
- > Entries are judged according to their originality and effectiveness in conveying the importance of the selected human right/ theme. The decision is final.
- > Prizes for each category: Winner \$150 each for the school and the student, Highly Commended \$50 each for the school and the student. Certificates are presented to all finalists and prize-winners.
- > WA prize winners are automatically entered in the national competition.
- > Winning entries are published in a calendar widely available for purchase.
