The disasters within Australia, New Zealand and Japan have shocked us all. They encourage questions and discussion about the climate change debate and the effect of changing weather patterns on one's life style. A number of statements have been issued on the United Nations website concerning the UN response to these disasters. UNAAWA was most honoured to have a visit from Senator Russell Trood on Friday 11 March 2011. Russell is conducting a review of the United Nations Association of Australia and during that process is visiting all UNAA divisions in Australia. The committee and members were able to meet with Russell to discuss issues. I thank those who found time to meet with Russell and particularly thank Russell for his time and interest in the association. He will be preparing a report for UNAA by the end of the year.

I have had a busy few weeks in the role of patron for International Women's Day and in that capacity had the opportunity to present several radio interviews and discuss along with the centenary of International Women's Day, the work of UNAAWA. On Monday 7<sup>th</sup> March 2011, I was honoured to be conducted into the inaugural role of honour of the Women's Hall of Fame. It was quite humbling to think that I was linked with such inspiring women as Edith Cowan, Georgiana Malloy, Fiona Stanley, Sue Gordon and Fiona Wood. I was honoured particularly for my work in the area of human rights and for those with disabilities in this state. It has been through the continued support of my husband George that I have been able to carry out my humanitarian work. Sadly he has been too ill to celebrate with me this week; however I do wish to acknowledge his support and encouragement over the years.

The recipe book "Celebrating Diversity in Western Australia - recipes from Migrant and Refugee Families in WA" was launched on March 4<sup>th</sup> at the Perth Town Hall. # Positions Vacant: Work in a dynamic organisation

These are voluntary positions and you will be contributing to a worthwhile organisation, United Nations Association of Australia WA Division.

- 1. Officer in charge of 2011 UNAA National Conference registrations: UNAAWA will host the 2011 UNAA conference to be held 4-7 August 2011. Work will entail assisting design of the registration leaflet, processing and recording registrations as received [most work is by email] and recording the details on a spreadsheet. You will be required to visit the office in Subiaco each week to collect relevant mail.
